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Welcome to BERA 2009 at Manchester University

It is with great pleasure that I welcome you to BERA 2009.

Conference committee look to build on previous conferences and 2009 promises to maintain the high standard of our conferences.

Our incoming President, John Gardner, is Professor of Education in the School of Education at Queen's University, Belfast. He has been engaged in educational research and teacher education at Queen's for over 20 years, having begun his career as a teacher in a Belfast grammar school. His teaching areas and research interests include assessment, ICT in education and research methods.

The Routledge Lecture, introduced by Graham Hobbs, will be given by Professor Ben Levin (Canada Research Chair in the Department of Theory and Policy Studies at the Ontario Institute of Studies in Education (OISE), University of Toronto). He is widely known for his work in educational reform, educational change, educational policy and politics. She is widely known for her work in the areas of teacher leadership and development, collaborative research, networks and school-university partnerships, and the problems and prospects for understanding educational change. She has fashioned a way to be both a scholar and an activist, a practitioner and a theoretician.

Immediately before this session, the BERA/SAGE Practitioner Research Award 2009 will be presented. The BERA Dissertation Award and the Best Student poster (sponsored by the University of Edinburgh) will also be presented during the conference.

The Panel discussion will be chaired by David Bridges (Professorial Fellow at the University of East Anglia) and they will consider 'The voice(s) of philosophy in the conversation of the Educational community'.

There was good feedback from both the 2008 Student Conference Doctoral Workshop and Writing Training Workshops. I am pleased to report that a similar programme will take place this year. The Writing workshop was oversubscribed many times and BERA are looking to fulfil the need by organising similar events during the year. The Routledge symposium on publishing in academic journals led by Graham Hobbs was similarly well received in 2008 and I am pleased to say that this symposium is again being repeated.

The winning Keynote Symposia are always popular sessions (lunchtimes on Thursday and Friday) and represent a wide range of areas of interest. A warm welcome is extended to colleagues presenting the International Guest Symposia (AERA, NZARE and AARE) that are featured in the programme. There are also special sessions reporting on the Strategic Forum for Research in Education (SFRE).

John Gardner is Professor of Education in the School of Education at Queen's University, Belfast. has been a head of the Graduate School of Education (1993-02) and Dean of the saculty of Legal, Social and Educational Sciences (20026). Since 1990, he has been principal investigation over 20 large and smallscale projects included the Nuffield-funded project: Analysis and Review of Innovations in Assessment (ARIA). As a proper of the BERA Council, he chaired the development of the Association's Revised Ethical Guideline See Educational Research (2004). He has been when ber of the Assessment Reform Group since 1994 and is an elected academician of the Academy of Learned Societies for the Social Sciences, a fellow of the British Computer Society, a member of the ESRC Teaching and Learning Research Programme Steering Committee, a member of the Research Assessment Exercise panel for Education, a founding member of UCET-NI and a former member of the General Teaching Council for Northern Ireland. He is the author or coauthor of five books and 100+ journal articles and his recent keynote presentations include the Georgia Board of Regents (Atlanta 2006), the Chinese Ministry of Education (Beijing 2007) and the Manitoba Association of Superintendents (Winnipeg 2008).

Professor Ben Levin who will speak in the Routledge Lecture, is a Professor and Canada Research Chair in Education Leadership and Policy at the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education, University of Toronto. His career is about half as an academic and half as a senior civil servant. He has just completed a second short period as as Deputy Minister (chief civil servant) for Education for the Province of

Ontario after also serving in that role from 2004 to 2007. From 1999 through 2002, he was deputy Minister of Advanced Education and Deputy Minister of Education, Training and Youth for the Province of Manitoba. He is a native of the City of Winnipeg who holds a B.A. (Honours) from the University of Manitoba, an Ed. M. from Harvard University and a Ph.D. from OISE. Levin has worked with private research organizations, school districts, provincial governments, and national and international agencies, as well as building an academic and research career. He has published five books, most recently, "How to Change 5000 Schools", and more than 200 other articles on education. His current interests are in large-scale change, poverty and inequity, and finding better ways to connect research to policy and practice in education.

Research, policy and practice: We what know, what we need to learn and what we need to do

The last decade has seen an explosion of interest in stronger links between research, policy and practice, not only in education but in many other fields as well. Ben Levin has been interested in this question for many years, and has worked on it both from the standpoint of policy and practice (in his multiple roles as a leader in education organizations) and as a researcher. He currently leads a research team on 'knowledge mobilization' at OISE (see www.oise.utoronto.ca/rspe). This presentation

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draws on these diverse experiences and perspectives to address three key questions.

- What is the state of knowledge about the relationship between research, policy and practice in education?
- What do we need to do to advance our knowledge?
- What steps should be taken now, based on what we already know, that would have the most positive effect on the relationship between research, policy and practice?

David Bridges (Professorial Fellow at the University of East Anglia, where he was previously Pro Vice Chancellor, and Chair of the Von Hugel Institute and Fellow at St Edmund's College, Cambridge. He is Honorary Vice President of the Philosophy of Education Society of Great Britain).

Introduction

There is an increasing awareness in the educational research community that as a generation of scholars trained in what at the time were viewed as the foundation disciplines of educational research – psychology, sociology, history and (specifically in this context) philosophy of education – pass out of the system something important may be lost to educational enquiry.

In introducing a symposium which attempts to identify what might be lost with reference to educational policy, teacher education and educational research David Bridges will emphasise the necessity for 'discipline' as a condition of anything which can properly lay claim to be research at all and also the ubiquitous presence of philosophical considerations in every corner of educational enquiry.

In a context in which we are being urged to improve the 'evidential basis' for educational decision making and teachers are urged to be more reflective about their practice, how can we ignore the importance too of bringing something rigorous and sustained to our dealing with these philosophical questions?



Morwenna Griffiths Professor of Classroom Learning at Moray House, Edinburgh University. She has taught in primary schools in Bristol before working in a number of Universities. Her research includes philosophical theorising and empirical investigation related to epistemology of auto/biography, social justice, public spaces, the nature of practice, feminisation and creativity.

Current educational philosophy in the conversations of educational policy makers?

Philosophers since Plato have argued that policy should be based on philosophy and, further, it should be formulated by people who are philosophically educated. Philosophers of education are no exception. However little attention has been given to whether these exhortations are practicable in current policy contexts. This presentation addresses this omission by pursuing the following question: How does (educational) philosophy have a voice in educational policy (if it does)? Then (and only then), are questions raised about the value of such a voice: Are these influences good ones? and, Are there better ways for philosophy to have a voice in policy?

Various possible answers are explored in the presentation. These use notions of complex identies and embodiment nomadic subjectivity and co-construction of narratives within 'smooth' and 'striated' spaces insofar as the context allows for a narrative sociality. We suggest that philosophically educated people move from academic institutions into policy ones, and, sometimes, continue to move to and fro. They may carry with them a philosophical sensibility and approach which influences how they contribute to the various stages of policy making: the identification of the problem and agenda setting, analysis, creation, legislation and/or adoption, implementation, and evaluation. Attention will also be given to specific stories of philosophically educated voices in the conversation of policy makers in recent times in the UK, Netherlands and Malta.

The voice of philosophy of education in the conversations of beginning teachers and initial teacher educators

The foundational disciplines in education have a necessary role to play in university based teacher education but this is underdeveloped in current provision. Good reasons will be identified for reappraising this situation made with specific reference to the contribution philosophy of education might make to enhance conversations about practice that take place during initial teacher education as well as contributing to PGCE assignments assessed at M Level.

In the past, educational foundations were introduced during PGCE courses - through formally delivered lectures, perhaps - in ways that were abstracted from concerns with classroom practicality that tend to preoccupy new teachers. A popular perception of theoretical reflection in education is that serves no 'useful' or 'relevant' purpose in the acquisition of professional knowledge most teachers need (a view that beginning teachers may also encounter in schools during their practical teaching experience). Hence, it has been sidelined on PGCE courses. This is unfortunate; the foundation disciplines do have a contribution to make that is practically relevant and important to those entering teaching.

However there are three reasons at least why university based initial teacher education should include at least some philosophical work. 'Good' teachers need to have clear aims for their teaching. 'Good' teachers need to understand clearly the role of the teacher. Moreover, 'good' teaching draws on practical wisdom; capability to apply abstract ideas about teaching to practice in ways that are technically and ethically justified.



Alis Oancea (Research Fellow at the University of Oxford. Her recent work includes: a study of quality in applied and practice-based educational research; a review of UK education research expertise post; a critical assessment of the "what works" discourse in research policy; and a scrutiny of the UK research assessment reform, based

on the analysis of peer review, bibliometrics, and econometrics in an international context.).

Philosophy and education research

Philosophy is intimately connected with the development of education research as a field and as a practice. I will comment briefly on three ways in which such connections develop.

First, philosophy of education research sustains "metareflection" about the philosophical underpinnings of education research and the analysis of epistemic standards and ethical issues of existing research projects; and philosophical analysis, critique and argument about how education research may contribute to education practice and policy, and the kind of warrants it provides to policy-makers and practitioners acting on its claims. Second, philosophy as education research is itself a valuable part of the education research community(-ies). Philosophical enquiry into educationally relevant issues can develop into research projects in their own right, alongside and in connection with other forms of education research. And third, philosophical interrogations, philosophical analysis (of substantive issues), and philosophical argument and critique support and complement other types of work in research projects across the field of education (philosophy for education research).

However, despite its important contribution to the field as a whole, work in philosophy of education and of education research is not adequately supported, in terms of funding and of "training", in the current research climate. The future of both education research and philosophy of education would be much brighter if their relationship was less, one of debate and competition for resources, and more, one of reflective participation in a never-ending "conversation" (Oakeshott). In such conversation, philosophical argument, as well as empirical inquiry, would be only "passages"—mutually enriching, but nonetheless unfinished.

She has worked with teacher unions, state and federal departments, reform groups and at all levels of schooling. In addition she has run two school university partnerships and created the National Center for Restructuring Education, Schools and Teaching (NCREST) with Linda Darling-Hammond at

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Teachers College. She is able to embrace the dualities of theory/practice process/content; intellectual/social-emotional learning; policy/practice to deepening the work of teachers and schools. To do this she has fashioned a way to be both a scholar and an activist, a practitioner and a theoretician.

From Action Research to Teacher Knowledge

In the early 50's at Teachers College, Columbia University in New York, Stephen Corey got the idea that the university should be more intimately involved in teaching practice. He and his colleagues invented the idea of action research – that is studying something that could be immediately changed and improved in schools.

Amidst a narrow focus on quantitative research, dominated by psychology, a slow movement began for teachers to study their own practice. During the 60's in the UK and to some degree in the US, teacher research began to gain some popularity. Many were trying to figure out how to collaborate with teachers, yet they were in universities often with narrow views of what was considered "good research".

A shift in the research community led by such scholars as Don Schon as well as those involved in organizational learning began to talk about how professionals "learn in action" and reflecting on their practice which was enthusiastically picked up by the educational community. That, along with a shift toward sociology and qualitative methods, gave way to a quest for getting closer to teaching practice and a concern for what teachers know.

All of this will be tracked by my own work over time, as well as others, as the field moved from action research to teacher/practitioner research to teachers' professional knowledge.

Examples from a number of collaborative studies will show how people, methods and a shift in focus legitimated narratives, vignettes, cases and, most importantly, that teacher knowledge could stand alongside research knowledge.

AERA Symposium

Education Research, Ethical Issues, and Making for Relevant Ethical Guidance - Sponsored by the American Educational Research Association

Thursday 03 September Session Number 2.25: University Place 2.219/2.220 Time: 09:00 - 10:30

This symposium focuses on the conduct of education research and the relevance of ethics codes. It will address ethical issues involved in the responsible conduct of research, the place and purposes of ethics codes, and the role of research associations in promoting sound and sensible guidance. The symposium will also consider the value of ethical guidance and yet the challenges involved in its meaningful promulgation and use. By focusing on contemporary questions and concerns about ethical guidance and research regulation, the symposium will discuss issues of broad significance and applicability for education research.

NZARE Symposium

Designing more effective instruction and pathways for student success

Thursday 03 September Session Number 4.24: Roscoe 2.5 Time: 16:30 - 18:00

In New Zealand, as in many other countries, there is a need to design and implement more effective instruction and more enabling schooling trajectories for 'minority students', to increase their access to university. In 2002, Aotearoa New Zealand was named as having the second highest rate of educational inequality in an OECD report. In particular, the large gap between students at the bottom and those in the middle of school achievement (commonly referred to as 'the tail') was highlighted. Our education system works well for some students, but has failed badly for a large number. Among those worst affected are the indigenous Mãori and immigrant Pacific Island populations. In a small and relatively intimate society such disparities are not sustainable.

A number of research and development programmes being carried out at the University of Auckland have been analysing key barriers and developing interventions in collaboration with primary and secondary schools and tertiary institutions, to change achievement patterns and pathways. All the research programmes from which the following papers are derived seek to transform educational outcomes for students from low socioeconomic schools with high numbers of M ori and Pacific students through the use of evidence-based methodologies. The papers in this symposium describe critical aspects of these programmes that can help change student outcomes.

Shaping Australian educational research: by whom, for whom, in whose interests?

This symposium presents brief vignettes/snapshots of five current Australian educational research projects, each of which has been initiated, commissioned or sponsored by different agencies and constituencies (or combinations thereof) which have shaped their purposes and practices in various ways. The presenters will briefly outline each research activity, drawing particular attention to questions about how these activities are shaped: by whom, for whom, and in whose interests?

Strategic Forum for Research in Education: concept, feedback and discussion

This session will share the history of SFRE and explore its rationale. It will describe what has happened so far and will provide an opportunity for discussion of issues raised and of possible future developments.

The intention of SFRE is to bring together academic, policymaker and practitioner stakeholders constructively explore issues and challenges which face educational research, in particular, when viewed in terms of its contribution to national 'knowledge management systems'. The initiative is being led by the British Educational Research Association (BERA) and the Economic and Social Research Council (ESRC) with funding being provided by BERA, ESRC, DCSF and CfBT. SFRE embraces all countries of the UK, both in its planning and participation. Andrew Pollard is Chair and will be leading the session with contributions from SFRE participants including Stephen Witt (DCSF), Karen Whitby (CfBT) Sue Davies (Trinity College, Carmarthen),

Ruth Leitch (Queens, Belfast) and Alis Oancea (SFRE Researcher 2009/10).

A template of questions has been developed to structure the work of the SFRE. This has six sections, and originated in the assessments of national systems conducted by OECD from 2000-06. At the heart of the template is the view that major forms of research (eg: disciplinary, applied, developmental, evaluative, practitioner) are complementary and necessary in an effective contemporary system. The sections are:

- Contextual issues
- Quality issues
- Capacity issues
- Disciplinary research
- Applied research
- Developmental research
- Evaluative research
- Practitioner research
- Priorities
- Knowledge accumulation
- Knowledge mediation
- Knowledge application

Addressing violence in schools is clearly on the policy and political agenda, in the UK, Europe and beyond, with an international expert in the field observing that: 'violence in schools has become a major preoccupation all over the world' (Debarbieux 2003: 582). The aim of this presentation is to give a progress report on the review. In doing so it addresses some of the key gaps and strengths identified in evidence accessed to date, and explains some of the methodological challenges so far encountered.

This session will explore the relationship between schools and social inequality. It will outline the evidence relating to broad policy approaches to breaking the link between education and disadvantage. Drawing these together, the session will ask: 'what can we learn from the existing literature, and what directions does this suggest for future policy and practice?'

1 MINUTES

- The minutes of the 33rd AGM held on 7th September 2007 were adopted as a true and accurate record of the meeting.
- Proposed by David Bridges, seconded by Brenda Taggart.

2 MATTERS ARISING

There were no matters arising.

3 REPORTS

3a President's Report

Pamela Munn's report was presented to the meeting.
 There were no comments or questions.

3b Treasurer's Report

- The 2007-8 Final Accounts were approved. There were no comments or questions.
- Proposed by Karl Wall, seconded by Jack Whitehead.

3c Chief Executive's Report

- Jeremy Hoad, BERA Chief Executive reported that the new BERA website is under development, the first phase of which was launched at the 2008 conference.
- This is supported by new back office systems and member services.
- This is one illustration of how the new BERA Strategic and Development Plans are being put into action.

4 EXECUTIVE COUNCIL ELECTIONS 2008

The results of the Elections to the Executive Council were confirmed:

- John Gardner is elected unopposed to the post of Vice-President. John serves as Vice-President for one year, will become President for two years (2009-11) and then Vice-President for one further year (2011-2012).
- Colin Rogers is elected to the post of Treasurer and Honorary Secretary.
- Uvanney Maylor is elected unopposed to the Executive Council with a portfolio yet to be allocated.

The following members of Executive Council now retire:

- Geoff Whitty (Vice-President and former BERA President)
- Sue Hallam (Treasurer and Honorary Secretary)
- Pat Mahony (Council Member and UCET Representative)
- Brenda Taggart (Council Member and Conference Committee Chairperson)

Other changes to the Executive Council were outlined:

- Ian Menter's term as an elected member of Council has now ended but Ian is now co-opted as the BERA / UCET Liaison representative in his new role as Chair of the UCET R&D Committee.
- Becky Francis' term of office as an elected member of Council has now ended but Becky is co-opted for one further year to oversee BERA Publications work.
- Danny Durant is co-opted as the Conference Committee Chairperson.

All retiring members of Council were thanked for their hard work and contribution to BERA activities.

5 MATTERS FOR DISCUSSION

5a Governance And Constitutional Review

Recommendations contained in paper 05a were considered.

CIO Status

- Jeremy Hoad, BERA Chief Executive, reported that the introduction of Charitable Incorporated Organisation ("CIO") status by the Charity Commission has been delayed until 2009.
- Executive Council has agreed that BERA should become a CIO once the option has been introduced. CIO status combines the benefits of Limited Liability status and Charitable status – as a result of becoming a CIO, individual trustees would no longer be liable, but the single, simple reporting structure through the Charity Commission would remain in place and BERA would not need to report to Companies House.
- The proposal that BERA Council bring forward recommendations for Constitutional change once CIO status has been introduced – either at the 2009 BERA AGM or at an Extraordinary General Meeting in 2008 or 2009- was proposed by Sue Hallam, seconded by Ralf St Clair.

The vote to adopt CIO status and hold an Extraordinary General Meeting to consider constitutional amendments was carried and there was one abstention.

Proposed Constitutional Amendments

A DELETE clause 7.7

- "No member of the Executive Council may serve as an employee of the Association or profit financially from the affairs of the Association."
- B RENUMBER relevant clauses in the constitution as necessary following the deletion of clause 7.7
- C AMEND clause 8.1.3 as follows:

8.1.3 (OLD)

no amendment may be made to Articles 2.0, 7.7 or this article without the prior written consent of the Charity Commission;

8.1.3 (NEW)

no amendment may be made to Article 2.0 or this article without the prior written consent of the Charity Commission;

- In line with new Charity Commission guidance, it was proposed that clause 7.7 of the BERA Constitution be deleted. The clause to be deleted specifically prevents any payments being made to trustees for work undertaken.
- Jeremy Hoad clarified that no trustee has been, or will be paid for carrying out their allotted portfolio duties. However, in circumstances where trustees are undertaking work for BERA which is clearly and explicitly beyond their role, the deletion of clause 7.7 would enable the Executive Council to consider making a payment to a trustee.
- An example given was that at present, no BERA Council member may undertake a BERA Research Review, as clause 7.7 prevents any payment being made for such work.
- Deleting the clause would enable BERA Council members to tender for the work (in the same way that any BERA member can) as and when such opportunities may be presented to the membership.
- The Charity Commission's guidance is clear and specific and states that BERA cannot pay trustees for their normal BERA work.
- The Charity Commission have approved, in principle, the deletion of Clause 7.7 from the BERA Constitution.
- The proposal to delete Clause 7.7 of the BERA Constitution was proposed by Ruth Leitch and seconded by Sam Twiselton.

The proposals were accepted in full and vote in favour of deleting clause 7.7 and making the other amendments as specified was carried with three abstentions.

ACTION

Chief Executive to confirm constitutional amendments to the Charity Commission.

 Chief Executive to monitor implementation of CIO arrangements by the Charity Commission and draft proposals as required.

5b Nominations To External Bodies And Proposals For Awards And Honours

Nominations to External bodies

- At present, the President and Vice-President are remitted to suggest nominees for the Academy of Social Sciences or other relevant bodies such as ESRC panels. Typically this occurs no more than twice or three times in a year and unless timescales are prohibitive, the opinion of the BERA Executive Council is sought.
- It was agreed that it is desirable to widen the nomination process where time permits and that it is important to seek input from the SIG Convenors and wider BERA membership if possible.
- It was further agreed that any calls for nominations should, as a minimum, seek input from the Executive Council, but that where time permits the wider membership could be consulted through the BERA website and Research Intelligence magazine.

- The British Honours system is widely used by the scientific community but less so by the Educational community.
 Members were asked to consider whether BERA should put Educational Researchers forward for honours (for work in the field of education research).
- During discussion it was acknowledged that as the honours system does exist, it could be used as a vehicle to raise the profile of educational research, which is in line with BERA's strategic aims.
- Following further discussion, it was the view of the majority of those BERA members present that BERA should not actively make nominations to the honours system.

5c Bera Ethical Guidelines

- The BERA Ethical Guidelines were last revised in 2004. The BERA Council considers it a matter of good practice to review the guidelines periodically, so a call for comments from members will be made in a forthcoming issue of RI.
- It was reported that the Research Methodology SIG welcomes the review and has suggested that the BERA Council consider creating a discussion forum to assist new and experienced researchers with ethics issues and case studies.

ACTION

BERA Council to consider how to take forward this suggestion.

Presidential Report 2008 – 2009

Pamela Munn, University of Edinburgh

This is my last report as I prepare to hand over the Presidency of BERA to John Gardner at conference in Manchester.

Over the past couple of years BERA's work has developed considerably with exciting international projects, new publications completed or in development and the adoption of new systems and services for members. With new initiatives come new challenges but I am pleased to leave BERA in rude health (although I remain Vice President for a further year, so do not depart the scene quite yet).

BERA conference

I would particularly like to thank Danny Durant as Conference Committee Chair for his considerable efforts in bringing BERA to Manchester. But the whole Conference Committee - Vivienne Baumfield, Jeremy Hoad, Carole Leathwood, Olwen McNamara and Sam Twiselton deserve thanks for ensuring this conference will be a successful and enjoyable event. And the event would not run without the professional services of In Conference, particularly Margaret Sherry and Amy Abel. BERA conference is our key event of the year and a great opportunity to find out what is going on across the breadth of educational research in the UK, meet colleagues and discuss contemporary concerns. The conference is not restricted to UK work, of course, and we will welcome participation from a wide range of international colleagues both in keynote presentations and various international symposia.

National Engagement

As reported in issue 108 of Research Intelligence BERA is particularly active at the moment in the area of new publications. Earlier this year we put out to tender two new publications to be called BERA Insights. Teams at the Universities of Manchester and Edinburgh are currently hard at work developing these publications on Schools and Social Inequality and Violence in Mainstream Primary and Secondary Schools respectively. There will be a chance for conference participants to hear about work in progress and the final publications should be available in Spring next year. I see these Insights as an important way to raise the profile of educational research, contributing to debates about enduring issues.

A tender process is also underway for a review of the Research Assessment Exercise 2008, its impacts on education departments in universities and related developments such as the Research Excellence Framework (REF). This will be supported by an analysis of the financial outcomes and consequences at departmental – or equivalent – level in higher education institutions across the UK which is being carried out by the Institute of Education in London. We are delighted to be working with the Universities Council for the Education of Teachers (UCET) who are co-funding this work with BERA as it will be crucial in providing a strong basis for BERA to continue to represent the interests of members both now and in the future.

The current issue of RI has a theme of fixed-term employment in educational research and Elaine Freedman highlights the publication last year of the 2008 BERA Charter For Research Staff: promoting quality conditions for conducting quality research. In these difficult times the importance of supporting staff at all career stages is particularly important and the future climate is likely to get more challenging. BERA is therefore at the forefront of engaging with key issues of quality and capacity building.

This links quite nicely to the Strategic Forum for Research in Education (SFRE). The second Forum event took place in Reading in June 2009 with a lively and widespread engagement with the issues affecting educational research in the UK. The report of this event is in preparation and highlights will be included in the next issue of RI. The third Forum is planned for March 2010 and information about the whole initiative can be found on the SFRE website at: www.sfre.ac.uk. I want to make particular mention of, and thank, Sarah Tough at the Institute of Education, London who has provided sterling support to the SFRE project. Coincidentally Alis Oancea (guest editor of RI for issue 108) will be providing future support to SFRE from the Autumn.

Other events and initiatives are in development which particularly link to BERA's strategic goals for capacity building and quality in educational research. These will be reported on more fully in future issues of RI and on the BERA website.

International Work

BERA is pleased to be a founding member of the World Educational Research Association (WERA). The organisation was established in San Diego in April 2009 but a formal meeting and launch will take place in Vienna in September 2009 during the ECER 2009 conference. It is a pleasant coincidence that the interim President of WERA is Ingrid Gogolin, former President of the European Educational Research Association. Felice Levine, Executive Director of AERA is the interim General Secretary of WERA. BERA will be represented

at the September launch and meeting of WERA by John Gardner who, by that point will be BERA President.

Other European activity is the continuing work on the EERQI project (European Educational Research Quality Indicators). BERA's engagement is led by David Bridges, working with Jeremy Hoad. David attended a meeting in July 2009 and will represent BERA at a further meeting in September 2009. An interim report on the EERQI developments and outcomes is scheduled for the end of 2009.

Final Comments

It is heartening that as I end my term as BERA President I am able to look forward positively to new developments, expanded engagement and exciting initiatives either underway or on the horizon. It has been a challenging and stimulating time. None of these activities would be possible, however, without the considerable efforts and support of BERA Executive Council members and I look forward to continuing to work with new and continuing members of BERA Council through the next year.

A number of Council members, elected, co-opted and observers, come to the end of their term of office in September and I pay tribute to their hard work for and commitment to BERA. Although we are metaphorically saying goodbye to four who are not seeking re-election, Becky Francis, Elaine Freedman, Carole Leathwood and Olwen McNamara we will be drawing on their services for BERA in various ways in 2009-2010. It is good to see the number of candidates putting themselves forward for the new round of elections. BERA depends on the interests and enthusiasm of its members to enable it to flourish.

I would also like to thank John Gardner for his support as Vice President and wish him well as he takes over the leadership of BERA. New initiatives and new challenges face John but the support of BERA Council, SIGS and other professional support will, I am sure, ensure continued success.

I hope to see many of you in Manchester at conference and hear about the wide variety of exciting new work and developments in educational research. After all, that is what we are all here for!

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
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


