Call for master class proposals

Deadline for submissions is January 22nd 2010.

The BERA annual conference is being held at Warwick University from 1st to 4th September 2010. We are looking to expand the range of training and development sessions on offer at our annual conference. We are planning to hold a series of master classes for doctoral and early career researchers during our conference.

We are now offering the opportunity for experienced educational researchers to run a master class in an aspect of scholarly work that is complementary to the kinds of training normally run by individual institutions. These might range from methodological approaches (e.g. use of large statistical data bases, analysing video transcripts) and academic literacies (e.g. writing for publication), to academic work (e.g. being an internal examiner, supervision pedagogies) and scholarly career building.

Masters classes will run for a half or a full day and will typically engage a small number of participants in a combination of formal input and 'hands on' activities. Limiting numbers is to ensure ample scope for everyone to be involved in the discussion, questions and networking among participants.

We now seek proposals from experienced researchers for master classes. Proposals should succinctly state:

1. Title of the master class
2. The nature of the training to be given and learning objectives
3. Who would benefit most from attending
4. Maximum and minimum numbers
5. Outline programme for the master class including details of activities
6. Who would lead the master class and their relevant experience, publications and contact details
7. Any connections with ongoing BERA SIG activities

Proposals will be reviewed by members of BERA council and conference committee. The deadline for submissions is January 22nd 2010 and decisions communicated to proposers in early April.
